

Colorado Statewide Food Insecurity Survey

This survey was conducted online among 535 Coloradans from April 13th - April 26th, 2021 and overall has a margin of error of +4.2%pts at the 95% confidence level. Respondents were identified via Dynata, an online panel recruiting firm, which generates a survey panel sample based on a stratified random sample with key demographics as the strata. Samples start by targeting respondents who are profiled as residents of the state of Colorado, ages 18+. The completed sample is then balanced by the following demographics based on the Census' American Community Survey (ACS) data for Colorado: gender, age, region (county groups), race, ethnicity and Household income in 2019. The survey was conducted with the support of Kupersmit Research, Hunger Free Colorado's long-time survey research partner.
